

JOURNEY TO BECOMING A TENNIS INSTRUCTOR

DBS, READINESS TEST*, FIRST AID*, CORE INSTRUCTOR TRAINING, ELECTIVE MODULE & ASSESSMENT

1 OBTAIN YOUR DBS FROM THE LTA * (£62.50 - £71.33)

Being asked to undergo a DBS check does is a standard legal procedure for anyone who's role involves direct and regular contact with children or vulnerable adults.

2 COMPLETE A READINESS TEST (£45) & BOOK FIRST AID COURSE (£95)

If a candidate doesn't has an LTA rating of 7.1 or better (to be replaced by a WTN when confirmed) they must complete a Readiness Test.

The first aid training due not need to be completed before attending day one of the Instructor core training.

If first aid training has been completed previously it must be one of the following; Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW), First Aid at Work (FAW), Paediatric First Aid (PFA). [Click here](#), to upload an existing certificate.

3 BOOK & COMPLETE 5 DAYS TRAINING

4 Days Core Training (£450) & an Elective module day (£50) of your choice. The LTA Instructor course consists of five days of face-to-face training, separated by a minimum of four weeks. This allows time for eight hours' work experience and coursework completion.

Candidates can complete the Elective before, during or after the core training.

5 QUALIFICATION ATTAINMENT & CERTIFICATION

Achieve a successful outcome for the summative assessment. Review qualification attainment status via accreditation section of [Coach Hub](#).

4 SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT (£60)

For candidates to book onto the summative assessment, you must have completed all elements of LTA training including elective module and hold a valid and accepted First Aid certificate

COURSE PRE-REQUISITES

- Must hold a Level 1 Coaching Assistant qualification the LTA Tennis Assistant or LTA Assistant qualification
- Must have an LTA rating of 7.1 or better (to be replaced by a WTN when confirmed) OR have successfully completed and passed the Readiness Test.
- Must hold a valid DBS certificate issued in the last 12 months
